Ms. Lisa at Graham thinks this is the best retelling of this story that she's ever read!






Ms. Mindy at Eatonville thinks you'll really like this book because it's SO funny!


Ms. Alison loves this book because each page is a puzzle to solve!



# SUNSCREEN PAINTING!

#### You will need:

- Sunscreen cream (not the spray on kind)
- Black paper (or really any dark color paper)
- Paint brushes (or fingers!)


#### How you do it:

- Use the sunscreen to paint a picture or write out a secret message on the paper.
  - Put your paper where it will be in direct sunlight for a few hours.
- Hold down your paper with some rocks so it doesn't blow away.
- Come back and observe how the sunscreen protected the paper from fading - just like the physical barrier of the rocks did!


