Calling "for" or "against" committee members for Sumner Library ballot measure

PIERCE COUNTY, Washington – Please contact the Pierce County Library System to be part of a "For" or "Against" Committee for the Library Capital Facility Area (LCFA) and bonds ballot measure to construct a new <u>Summer Pierce County Library</u>. As part of the Nov. 7, 2023 General Election, the Pierce County Library System and City of Summer are asking voters to consider the LCFA and bonds ballot measure to ask voters to fund the building with \$15 million in bonds.

The Library System estimates the total project cost at \$19 million in today's market. In addition to the bonds, the Library System is committed to contributing \$5 million through a variety of sources, including private donations, which helped to reduce the amount of the bonds.
