# 2022 Operating Revenue

- \$48,194,100
- 97.3% of the funds for library services comes from property taxes. By state law, library systems may collect up to 50 cents per \$1,000 of a property's assessed value.
- 39.1 cents per \$1,000 of assessed property value was the 2022 tax rate.
