

























#### **Snack, Activity, and Games**

#### Colorful Snack!

Think about the different foods you like to eat and their different colors.

Make snack time a chance to eat many foods that are the same color.

Here are a few ideas to try - Have fun!

Red Foods - Tomatos, strawberries, raspberries, red apples or grapes, pizza with red sauce, toast with strawberry jam

Yellow Foods - Bananas, cheese, pears, popcorn, macaroni and cheese, tortilla chips

Green Foods - Avocados, kiwi, green apples or grapes, cucumbers or pickles

Purple - Blackberries, purple grapes, plums, purple tortilla chips, grape juice, purple carrots



#### **Sensory Activity: Mixing Bag**

Credit: <u>Colors Storytime (storytimesprout.com)</u>
Put two primary paint colors (tempera paint works great) in a Ziploc bag,
trying to get each to stay on one side. You may also add some shaving cream for extra fun.
Then, seal the bag and tape the top with duct tape.

Now you have a no mess coloring mixing bag that kids will love swishing with their fingers!

To help children understand about mixing two colors to make a third color,

put blue paint on one side of the bag and red paint on the other = PURPLE!

You can combine blue and yellow to make GREEN or red and yellow to make ORANGE.



#### Red Light, Green Light, Yellow Light, Purple Light GAME

Call out different colors or hold up colorful paper.

Children act out different motions based on the color they see..

Red means STOP. Green means GO. Yellow means go SLOW.

What if you were to add in another color like **Purple?** How would you move then? Spin or twirl? Crawl? Or Tiptoe?


Switch back and forth between different colors.
Invite your child to call out colors too.

This game teaches waiting, listening, and following directions, good skills to practice for school.




#### Color the Shapes in Fruits













#### The Color Wheel

Color in the wheel using the correct primary and secondary colors.


Primary colors = RED, YELLOW, BLUE

Secondary colors = ORANGE, GREEN, PURPLE


