



























Rhymes, Games, and Activities

Rhyming Game - for Home or the Car

This is a fun game to play if you are on a drive or just looking for an easy game to play at home. Call out a word (could be any word but hopefully one that has a lot of rhymes) Everyone else calls out anything that rhymes with the first word. These do not have to be "real" words - nonsense words are great!

Here are a few ideas -

CAT = Bat, Mat, Sat, Rat, Splat, Drat, Zat, Gnat!

BEAR = Care, Dare, Scare, Lair, Zare, Fair, Pear, Hare!

Play as many rounds of the game as you like.

For more of a challenge, write the first word and see if your child can read it before calling out a rhyme.



Color, Draw, or Write to Music

This is a wonderful way to relax and be creative.

Put out paper, pencils, markers, crayons, or anything else you would use for coloring or drawing (or writing). Put on whatever type of music you wish.

Perhaps starting with just instrumental music (no singing or words) could be fun since it is so open-ended.

Music makes us feel so many different emotions.

Invite your child to color, draw, or write to their hearts content.

They can show what they created later or not.










SENSE OF SIGHT

Look at each picture. Circle the pictures of objects that can help you see in the dark.




SENSE OF TASTE

Look at each object. Color the following objects that can make sounds.




Sense of Touch


