## Stretch Game: Sea Life Pictures and Dice!

Find pictures of animals that live in the ocean.

Search in books or magazines, print out pictures from the web,  
draw your own sea animals,

or use some of the pictures in this activity packet!

Find some dice from another game in your home.

To play the game, think about how each of the animals  
from your pictures might move.

Toss the dice to see how many times you will move like each animal.

Here are a few movement ideas -

**Whale = jump up out of the water**

**Octopus = wiggle your arms**

**Sea Turtle = make your arms glide**

**Sea Otter = float on your back**

**Stingray = spread your arms out wide and float**

**Fish = Make your hands swim**



## Under the Sea Snacks

### What you need:

Graham crackers or rice cakes

Blueberry yogurt or cream cheese

Goldfish crackers

Crushed graham crackers (*optional*)

Blue food dye (*optional*)

Decorate an under the sea picture for your snack! Spread some blueberry yogurt or blueberry cream cheese onto a rice cake or graham cracker. Place goldfish crackers on the "water." If you want to make your yogurt extra blue, you can add a drop of food dye before spreading. You can also crush some graham crackers and add it as "sand" for your snack.

### What you need:

Construction paper

Elmer's glue bottle

Sand (*you can purchase from Walmart, Hobby Lobby, or Amazon*)

Draw a picture or write a word with the glue.

Shake the sand over the top of the glue on the paper.

Let it sit for a few minutes and shake off extra sand.

Let it dry for about an hour.

*\*To make dry sand paint, mix 1 cup of sand with 1 Tablespoon powdered paint.*

*Put into a shaker and shake the sand paint onto your glue design.*



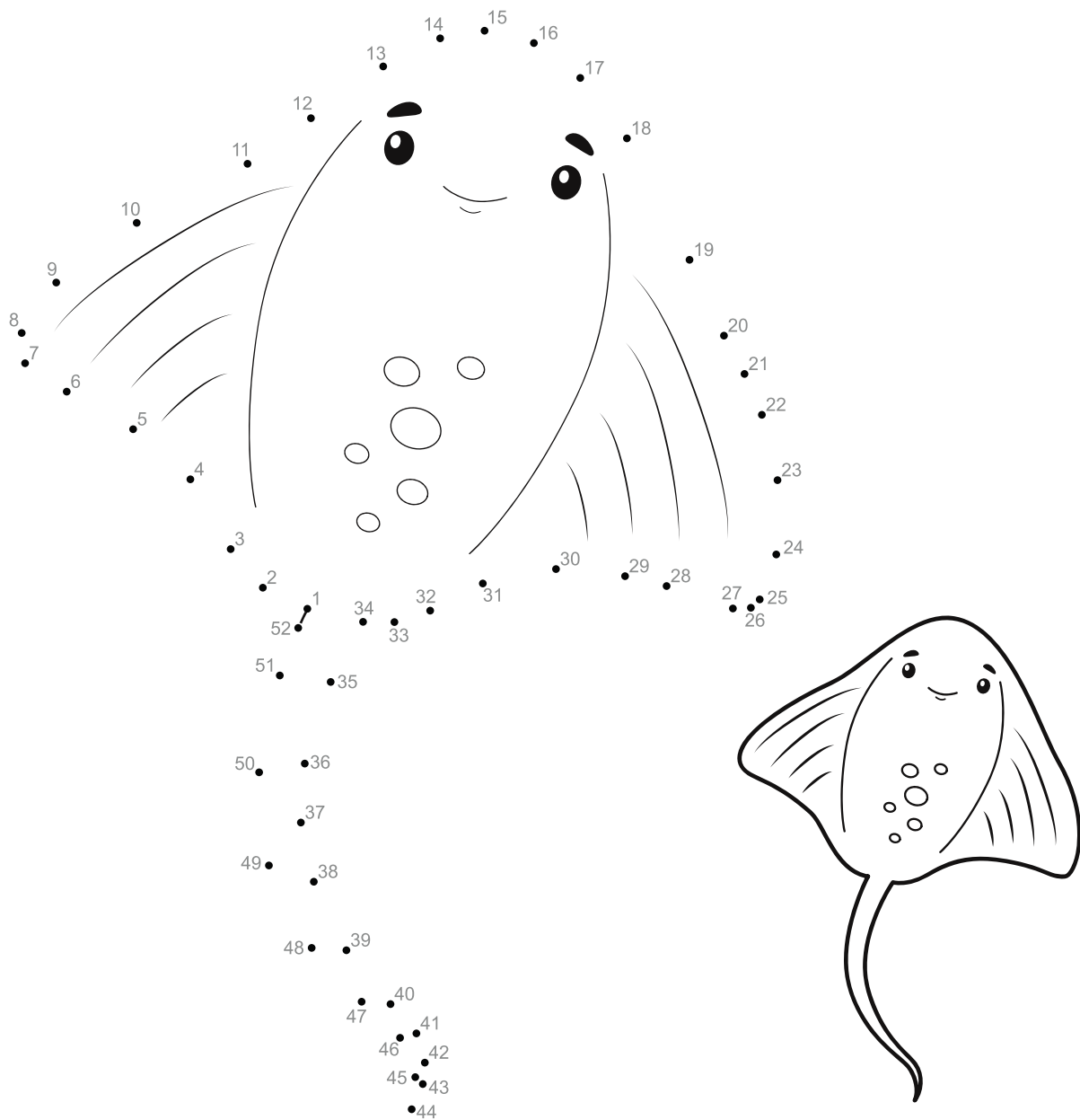
