"As we celebrate the beginning of a new chapter here in Sumner, this groundbreaking isn't just about bricks and mortar," stated Pierce County Library System Board of Trustees Chair Pam Duncan. "It's also about building a future rooted in learning, connection and opportunity."

In August of 2023, the Sumner community voted to create a Library Capital Facility Area (LCFA) and bond(s) to build a new Sumner Library. The City and Library System are collaborating to build a new, modern, centrally located, community-focused library with books, materials and all services accessible for the diverse residents of Sumner.

"Sumner's library keeps growing and changing with the community it serves," said Mayor Hayden. "This new building brings a new chapter to this story. And it's an exciting chapter."
