Pierce County Library Board holds first meeting of 2026

PIERCE COUNTY, Washington – At the Pierce County Library System’s Board of Trustees’ **Wednesday, Jan. 14, 3:30 p.m.**, regular meeting, the Board will begin their review of the recommendations outlined in the Library’s Comprehensive Capital Plan report. Throughout 2026, library staff will break down the capital planning report and recommendations for trustees to review and discuss.

- Presentation of the 2026 Pierce County Library Foundation/Library Agreement.
- Discussion of Board bylaws, upcoming trustee vacancy and emerging library trends.

In 2026, four of the Board’s monthly meetings will take place at branches (February-South Hill Library; May-University Place Library; August-Parkland/Spanaway Library; November-Fife Library).
