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## **South Hill Pierce County Library closed Wednesday, July 22**

**PIERCE COUNTY, Washington** – The South Hill Pierce County Library will be closed on Wednesday, July 22 for staff development. The library will reopen for regular hours on Thursday, July 23.

The nationally acclaimed [Pierce County Library System](#) serves 686,500 people throughout Pierce County with 19 libraries and online services. The system is the fourth largest in the state and property taxes are the main funding source. People may choose from more than one million books, e-books, audiobooks, movies and other materials. Through the Library's strategic plan, the Pierce County Library strives to empower the people of Pierce County by advancing all forms of literacy, championing access to information, creating inclusive and inspired spaces, and enriching lives. People make approximately one million visits to Pierce County Libraries each year. The Library provides services and programs directly to people in adult care facilities, people who are homebound, and to children in childcare centers and schools.
